Chapel Hill Elementary School Update

According to The Tennessean, Chapel Hill was listed as #22 in 2005 as one of the "Fastest Growing Cities in Tennessee." Although two years have passed since this list was published, Chapel Hill continues its growth spurt. Along with expansion of our city limits, comes the growth in our schools. For the first time in school history, every grade level in our school exceeds 100 students. Our enrollment has reached an all-time high with as many as 824 students this year surpassing the 668 students from the previous school year. Our faculty and staff have also grown to eighty-five, adding nineteen new faces this year alone. For the first time, CHES has a new assistant principal, Mr. Stanley Murphy. However, in the fall, the teachers and sixth graders along with approximately 111 graduating fifth graders will return to Forrest School to enjoy their new facilities. We wish each of the students much success while they continue their secondary education at Forrest School.

As CHES transitions to a K-5 school for the 2007-2008 school year, we look forward to continuing the annual traditions at Chapel Hill Elementary School. We would like to invite you to join us for some of these special events for the upcoming school year:

A Note from the Historian:

Because of over crowding the students of Forrest School will move into a new 20-room addition this fall. These classrooms will replace portables that have become a part of the school's landscape and will enable a better separation of middle and high school students and classes.

While Chapel Hill has faced tremendous growth over the past few years, the trend of an overflowing building is apparently not a new phenomenon for Forrest School. The following is an article from the school newspaper, The Wizard, dated September 1927. It is interesting "how the more things change, the more they stay the same."

Building Overflowing

In order to retain our rating as a first class high school this year, it was necessary, at the recommendation of the State High School Inspector, W.A. Bass, to relieve some of the congestion caused by the grades. Permission was granted by the Methodist Church to use certain rooms in the basement and three grades under the supervision of Mrs. Alden Marshall and Mrs. J. L. Nunley are being quartered these.

As some of us bemoan the growth of our school and community, this 80-year-old article gives one pause to imagine how the people of that 1927 Chapel Hill community felt about the growth and what they would say about the Chapel Hill community of 2007.
